

VILLAGE OF LAKEVIEW
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
April 9, 2024

President Griffith called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Members Present: President Emily Griffith, Trustee Dominic Trevino, Trustee Jyll Mitchell, Trustee Kate Behrenwald, and Trustee Chris Fryover.

Members Absent: Trustee Lane Leppink and Trustee Greg Saxton

Also Present: Manager & Chief, Darin Dood, Lieutenant Bill Russell, OIC Jared Nielsen, DPW Supervisor Brian Bucholtz and Clerk Melissa King.

AGENDA APPROVAL: Trustee Trevino moved and Trustee Fryover seconded to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Dutch Rushmore, 108 Mill Street, wanted to thank all council members for the job they do on the Council Board. She asked if the public comment that is on the agenda could again be added at the end of the meeting. This would give residents a chance to comment about an agenda item that is going to be discussed and a chance to speak on what has been discussed at the meeting. Ms. Rushmore noted that she has a petition for local zoning control for those who are interested or would like more information after the meeting.

STANDING ITEMS

Trustee Behrenwald moved and Trustee Mitchell seconded to approve the meeting minutes from March 12, 2024 as presented. Motion carried.

Trustee Behrenwald moved and Trustee Fryover seconded to approve the bills in the amount of \$109,711.85 as presented.

REPORTS

Lieutenant Russell did not add anything to his report.

Supervisor Bucholtz noted they recently painted the parking lines in the downtown area. They went from 14' spacing to 12' spacing which allows for extra parking in the downtown area.

OIC Nielsen added the cement pad was placed at the sewer ponds for the building to house the new blower. They have received the new meters and are preparing for the new meter read system that should be arriving any day.

Manager Dood added that the entire police department did a CPR/First Responder training and are recertified for two years. He noted that the conference he attended with OIC Nielsen

provided valuable information and allowed them to meet people to network with and learn from. They submitted a water sample at the conference and took 2nd place in the taste testing. Manager Dood noted he will be looking for a replacement for Lieutenant Russell who will be retiring at the beginning of 2025.

BUSINESS

DPW Supervisor Brian Bucholtz received a letter of Exemplary service and Meritorious Conduct award for realizing crime was a foot and taking action.

ADJOURN: Trustee Trevino moved and Trustee Behrenwald seconded to adjourn the meeting at 7:18 PM. Motion carried.
